Holi Festival

This festival is closely related to the water festivals of Thailand and Myanmar and takes place on the full moon day in the month of Flagun (21st March). By this time Winter has come to an end and its starting to get warm. It is also nearing the end of the dry season, so the water that is sprayed around so liberally during the festival is a

reminder of the monsoon days to come. Holi is also known as the festival of colours, so as well as spraying water on everything and everyone, coloured powder (particularly red) and coloured water are also thrown everywhere. Exams

The children finished their end of year exams on Friday 28th March (Nepali New Year is on 14th April) so are now enjoying 2 weeks of school holidays. We are delighted to announce that ALL children passed, with many of them achieving 1st, 2nd 3rd in their class again. Exam results will be sent out to sponsors shortly. Eleven of the children made such outstanding progress over the year achieving almost full marks, so those children will be skipped up a year level. Well done!

School holidays are always great fun at Sunrise, and these holidays will be action packed, with a sportsday, singing, dancing, poetry writing and drawing competitions, quizzes, inter-children's home sporting matches, outreach work, 1st aid course, a slide show night, work experience and some children's interviews (which we hope to share with sponsors on a new 'sponsor only' section on the website).

Training and Development Computing and Sewing

The children are continuing to improve their computer skills, and the carers have embraced the sewing machines, with carer Fulmaya taking extra sewing classes and making the children's new school uniforms and some play clothes.

Thanka painting

After around 70-80 hours of dedication and hard work, the older children will finish their thanka paintings in the holidays. We will then frame them and put them proudly on display at Sunrise.

The thanka teacher has expressed his congratulations to the children for their dedication and great skill and believes that some of them could build a career from it. For those children that wish to continue, we plan to sell their future paintings in Australia, with 70% of profits going into a separate bank account for that child's future, perhaps 5% for spending money and the remaining 25% back to Sunrise.

On 8th March all children at Sunrise received MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) immunizations – if only injections could be this much fun all the time!



Sunrise Outreach Program

In early March four members of our Sunrise Outreach Team (Lokjan, Saugat, Pema and Dolma), along with Sangita and Emma, visited the people of Kalimati, an area of Kathmandu where over 120 families live in temporary shanty homes along the dirty river bank.

There each child, equipped with pre-prepared questions and discussion points, sat with families and children and facilitated introductions from both sides and sought to identify the needs of these people. Given the dirty and unhygienic conditions in which they live, one key need identified was that of immunizations. In partnership with the local community and the Sunrise committee we plan to disperse Hepatitis B and MMR immunizations to these people.
